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41 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Thirty-Fourth General Synod of the United Church 42 of Christ condemns the use of prolonged solitary confinement by the United States and any 43 government in the world, including national, state, local, and military jurisdictions, 44 immigration detention centers, and private prisons and calls on our government to explore and 45 implement alternatives to isolated confinement.

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**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Thirty-Fourth General Synod of the United Church of Christ calls on all members of the United Church of Christ to demand that their government ends any use of prolonged solitary confinement in prisons, jails, and detention centers, whether publicly run or contracted with private companies.

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53 54 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that as Christians we are called to amplify the voices of the oppressed, including the voices and leadership of the formerly incarcerated who return to society with an intimate knowledge of prison policies and offer first-hand knowledge of the harm caused by prolonged solitary confinement.

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59 60 **BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED** that the Thirty-Fourth General Synod of the United Church of Christ invites calls all settings to work with other faiths and human rights groups, including the National Religious Campaign Against Torture<sup>10</sup>, among others, to condemn the torture of prolonged solitary confinement, and work towards its abolition in the United States and around the world, and support humane and restorative alternatives.

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**FUNDING**: The funding for the implementation of the Resolution will be made in accordance with the overall mandates of the affected agencies and the funds available.

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**IMPLEMENTATION:** The Officers of the Church, in consultation with appropriate ministries or other entities within the United Church of Christ, will determine the implementing body.
