AFFIRMING GUNS TO GARDENS AND OTHER GUN VIOLENCE PREVENTION **MINISTRIES**

A Resolution of Witness

WHEREAS we are called to co-create with the Holy Spirit the kingdom of God in this world -a

24	Christ calls on individuals, congregations, associations, and conferences in the United Church of
25	Christ to learn about the Guns to Gardens project and prayerfully consider if it is a ministry to
26	which they are called as part of our witness to prevent gun violence, save lives, and provide
27	healing for a nation traumatized by violence;

 BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Thirty-Fourth General Synod of the United Church of Christ asks Justice and Local Church Ministries to compile and share materials from existing gun violence prevention ministries to assist UCC congregations with guidance in offering gun violence prevention ministries.

FUNDING: The funding for the implementation of the resolution will be made in accordance with the overall mandates of the affected agencies and the funds available.

IMPLEMENTATION: The Officers of the Church, in consultation with appropriate ministries or other entities within the United Church of Christ, will determine the implementing body.
